Gerrish Township Police Monthly Report 04-01-15 through 04-30-15

The Gerrish Township Police Department responded to a total of 142 calls for service for the month April 2015.

The Department reports 8 custodial arrest statistics this month. (See attached report for breakdown).

The Department reports 33 total citations listing 33 traffic violations, 7 misdemeanor violations, 1 Municipal Civil Infraction and 13 verbal warnings for the month. (See attached for breakdown).

Training:

16 continuing education training hours are reported this month. (See attached detail document).

Chief Hill highlighted activity for the reported month is as follows:

- 1) I attended the regular Township board work session as required and presented many topics for review by the board.
- 2) I attended the MACP Legislative and Executive Board meetings.
- 3) I attended the Northern Michigan Chiefs of Police meeting.
- 4) I attended the ACT-Now Executive Board meeting in my Advisory role to the group.
- 5) I met with representatives of the State Law Enforcement Torch Run to shore up our 2015 September Community Run and to order the necessary fundraising items associated with the event.
- 6) I conducted two staff meeting this month where various required training was presented.
- 7) I attended the AVI planning meeting preparing for the all-County drill at the Roscommon Area Public Schools in September of 2015.
- 8) I attended a webinar with our Records Management Software regarding new releases to the program.
- 9) I chaired and attended the monthly 911 Technical Board meeting in my role as Chairperson.
- 10) I attended the regular Township Board meeting as required.
- 11) I met with the Prosecutor and D/Sgt John Wybraniec to discuss the concept and required paperwork regarding domestic violence arrests in Roscommon County in an attempt to standardize the paperwork involved so that it would provide improvement and ultimately increased convictions rates regarding domestic violence in our County.

- 12) I attended and moderated the ACT-NOW Community meeting regarding proposed Swimmers Itch programs for 2015 in Higgins Lake.
- 13) I attended the monthly Law Enforcement Administrators meeting and lunch at Fred's Restaurant in Roscommon.
- 14) I met with Candidate Fick and Sgt. Patchin for clarification of Background investigation information to move the process of hiring along.
- 15) The Department turned over 74 lbs. of unwanted prescription pills to the Tip of the Mitt Watershed council at the Petoskey Department of Public Safety.

Highlights this month for the Department include;

ACT-NOW and the Police Department have agreed once again to partner on the "Scrap Metal Project." You may drop off items of scrap and ACT-NOW will dispose of same and the use of the funds will be for Community projects to included scholarships at the local High School, Shop with a Cop, winter heating assistance for the elderly, etc.
The ACT-NOW trailer is placed next to the impound lot and ready for people to drop off their metal in the trailer.
