MARINA MANAGER REPORT AUGUST 2, 2018

- After several years of serving as Lead Marina Worker, Jeremy Weinel has accepted a full-time position with another employer. We thank Jeremy for his dedication to the marina and wish him well in his new position.
- I am recommending that the board approve the promotion of Steve Myer to the position of Lead Marina Worker. Steve has not only performed well as a marina worker, but he also performs duties at Carlos Park.
- Marina team members have had a mid-season performance evaluation completed and placed in their personnel file. One remains to be completed.
- In July, the marina sold 10,306 gallons of fuel.
- In August, I will inform our marina patrons that in 2019, they will no longer be able to assign their boat space to another boater. In 2019, their marina registration will not be complete until we have a copy of their Michigan Boat registration that matches the name of the permittee.
- In anticipation for the 2019 season, the marina staff is suggesting seasonal fees for Launch & Go patrons, rather than month-to-month payments. We ran this idea past several current customers without any negative feedback.
- The staff has made several adjustments to a few boat lifts to accommodate patrons. Hoist locations on finger docks, and all dock numbers will be remarked for next season.
- The Marina Customer Appreciation Party will be Saturday August 18 from 1:00 – 4:00 p.m. In anticipation of the August party, our staff has been busy cleaning and painting inside the main marina building.
- The staff is putting together a plan to remodel the marina office. This will occur after the closing in October.
- Reservations are still coming in for transient slips for the Labor Day holiday.
- Safety cones for the launch ramp pedestrian walkway will be obtained from the RCRC.
- The marina golf cart has worn out and needs to be replaced. It has been determined that repairing is not an option.
